### Incoming 1st Grade Summer Reading Requirements

Please read to someone, or have someone read to you as often as possible. Mark a smiley face on the dates that you listen to a story. Mark a star on the dates when **YOU** read to someone. We want to see at least three listens and three reads each month.

During the months of June, July and August, you must write 9 journal entries total. Your journal entries can be about anything, but they should include a colorful picture and at least 3 neatly written sentences. Please use one of your first grade primary composition journals from the supply list to complete your journal entries. Please bring the primary journal with the completed journal entries to school on the first day. This book will be used more throughout the school year for different writing activities.

Parents, please help your child with their journal writing. You can do this by asking your child to make the sounds that they hear in each word, and have them write down the letter that makes those sounds. (E.g. a child may write the letters dans for dance) This is called phonetic spelling and if they can do this, they are on the right track to writing success!

This assignment <u>MUST</u> be turned in during the first week of school in order to earn a prize. This assignment will also be used as your child's first reading and writing grade.

Students, please ask an adult to help you learn how to tie your shoes this summer! It will get easier each time you practice.
